

Emergency Drill at Kanazawa University, Kakuma Campus in 2023

**Monday, October 16, 2023, 12:00 p.m.-12:40 p.m.
(Evacuation Drill: 12:00 p.m.-12:15 p.m.)**

◆Objective

- Prepare students, faculty and staff for evacuation in case of major earthquakes and to raise awareness about disaster prevention.
- Review organizational actions to minimize damage.

◆Participants

Students, faculty and staff

◆Assumption

An earthquake with an intensity of upper six on the Japanese seven-stage seismic scale strikes Kanazawa. The Earthquake Early Warning (EEW) is issued. After 10 seconds of the warning, strong tremors arrive and continue about one minute. Although the entire infrastructure stops working, communication network systems are secured by emergency power supply.

◆Drill Contents

- Evacuation of students, faculty, and staff to the designated evacuation areas.
- Organization of the disaster control headquarters, conducting a drill, and verifying the chain of command.
- Organization of the fire brigade team and conducting a drill.
- "C-SIREN" Drill.
- Fire extinguisher training using a water extinguisher (South area).

◆Evacuees Confirmation Method

University staff will count the number of evacuees.

◆ Timetable

12:00	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When the evacuation drill is announced, students should immediately take cover under their desks for one minute.
12:01	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Following the faculty's instructions, students start evacuation and proceed to the designated shelter areas.• At the shelter areas, students form lines, and the university staff will count the number of evacuees.
Around 12:15	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A person in charge of the disaster operations announces completion of the evacuation drill. ⇒ Break up

◆ Even in rainy weather, there are no limitations for participants and designated evacuation areas.
